

Opportunity Award Scholarship

Each year the Denver A&M Club awards scholarships to incoming freshmen that are residents within the DAMC region through the University's Opportunity Award scholarship program. In 2019, the DAMC will distribute \$6,000 in scholarships to deserving students.

The applicant pool determines the number of scholarships and specific amounts awarded. The Club receives a list of qualified applicants from Texas A&M University. The scholarship committee, made up of Club Officers, selects scholarship recipients. To be considered: (1) complete the general scholarship application through Apply Texas, (2) must reside in the Club's region, and (3) must be admitted to Texas A&M University as a freshman for the Fall 2019 semester. At the Summer picnic, the 2019 scholarship recipients will be announced.
